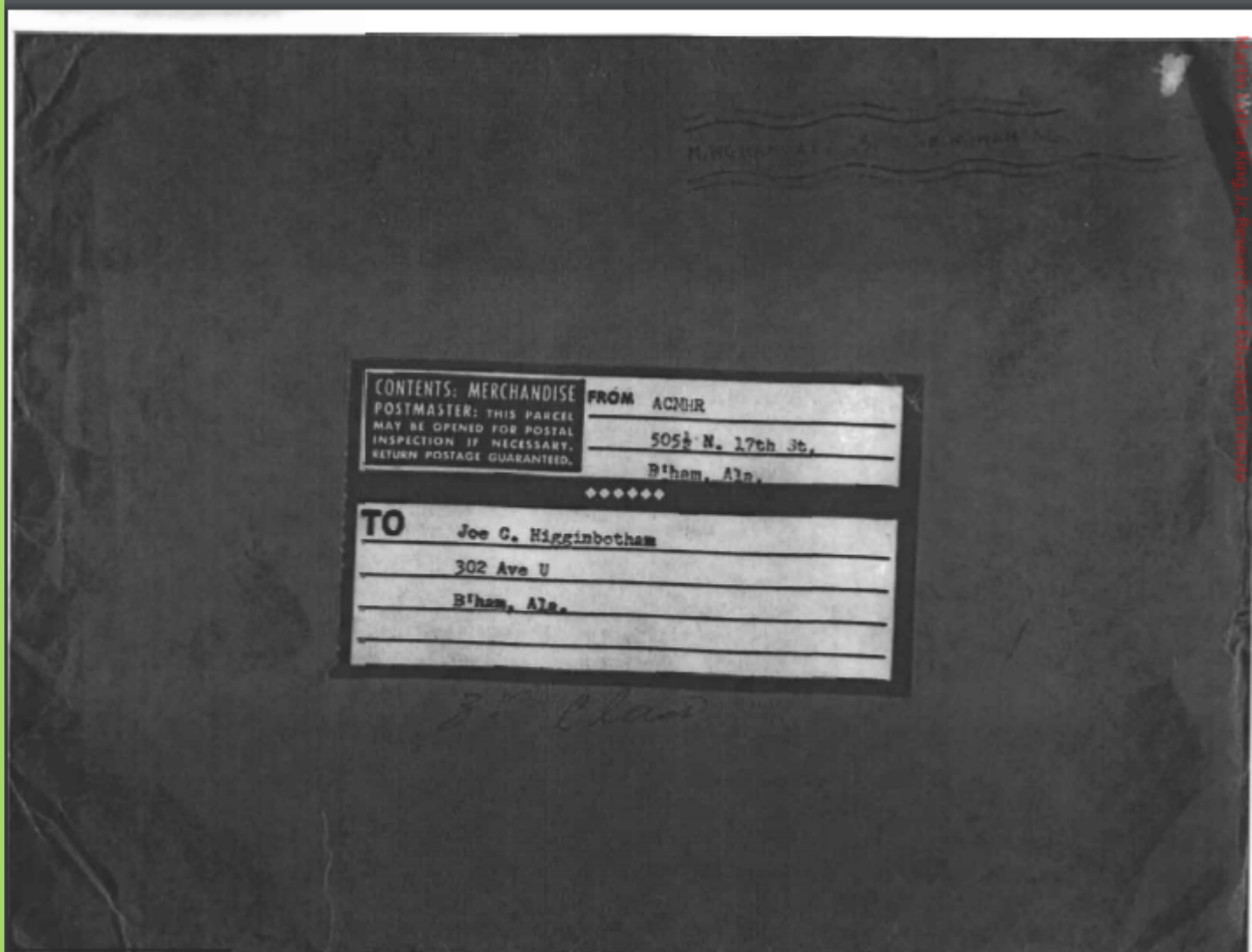
An hour long podcast by researcher-storyteller Brené Brown with **Black scholar and author Ibram X. Kendi** on his book "How to Be An Antiracist."
